Helping Kern County Improve And Maintain Our Roads

Roads are a vital piece of our community infrastructure that need periodic maintenance to be kept in tip-top shape. While RCSD has no jurisdiction or authority over our community's roads, our public works crew does their very best to keep traffic flowing by supporting Kern County Public Works.

As an unincorporated area in Kern County, Rosamond has no local public works department. Instead, our community relies on Kern County Public works for road construction and maintenance. As much as RCSD would like to fill pot-holes or repair storm damage, we legally cannot since this authority is not granted to RCSD.

What RCSD can and does do is maintain our water and sewer distribution equipment, like manhole covers, and patch the asphalt after pipeline maintenance or repair. For example, RCSD crews were hard at work preparing our utility access, like manholes, before Kern County Public Works began their Rosamond Boulevard project.



This partnership between RCSD and Kern County Public Works is part of what makes Rosamond a great place to live and work. Remember, if you have a water or sewer emergency, reach out to the RCSD team.
